Fall Festival: Registration begins on October 1. Rachel Harmatuk reminded members that all information is on the FLMF website under Events.

RCC Recitals: These recitals will be October 17 and May 22. Information is on the website.

Holiday Serenades: Annie Feigles is working on this event but was unable to attend the meeting or to send a report.

Ensemble Festival 2022: Sharon Reck updated members. She has resubmitted preferred dates. The tentative concert date will be February 19 with a snow date of February 26. All the music and recordings are on the website. Paul Westray will conduct the festival.

Social Media: Beverly Teague suggested setting up an FLMF Instagram account. Caleb Nei is a jazz pianist recommended by Bev. He had good suggestions for successfully marketing through Instagram. See www.calebnejazz.com.

Harpsichord: Rachel Harmatuk is storing the instrument. It will move to Libby McConnell later this month.

Officers: The positions of VP and Harpsichord Chair remain open.
