The group purchased three small keyboards and three electronic percussion pads, which will be used by attendees to play along with the symphony during the concert. The concert will be March 21 at 4 pm at Stone Bridge High School and is free to attend.

The next Reston Community Center recital is May 16. Please register online by April 27. Darya Gabay will continue next year as recital chair but would appreciate having a co-chair. Shandra Love is unable to continue in the position.

The Pro-Arte Chamber Orchestra requests the use of the harpsichord on Friday, May 29, for Vivaldi's Four Seasons. Maria Baylock will work out logistics with the orchestra.

The Ensemble Festival committee had its recap meeting. Music selection meetings will be at Sharon Reck's home on March 25, April 8, and April 29.

The next meeting will be the May 13 potluck at Beverly Teague's home. Phyllis Vicker's home is the backup, in case Beverly's grandchild is born early.

Sharon Reck discussed that we do not have an annual soiree scheduled. Members should consider whether a summer soiree would be a good addition to our calendar for the year.
