

The Fairfax-Loudoun Music Fellowship met on Wednesday, May 13, 2015, at Bethel United Methodist Church in Lucketts. Sharon Reck opened the meeting at 10:30 am. Libby McConnell read the March minutes. They were approved as read.

Sherri Stricker was thanked for her long-time membership as she moves away to Texas. She has served FLMF as a former president and in other offices.

Libby McConnell presented the reasons for discontinuing a printed handbook, which include cost and time savings. All of the handbook information is available online at www.flmf.org, and Jeri Bennett announced that even the member directory is now available on the website in the password protected area. In a unanimous vote, members agreed to discontinue producing the handbook. The sound equipment needs rules and guidelines. Sandy Baker will start writing these rules this summer so that members know how to use, move, and rent the equipment. Members willing to be on a committee for this purpose should contact Sandy.

Sandy Baker presented artistic options created by Ann Reck for FLMF printed communications. Members chose the options that will be used for labels, letterhead, note cards, and envelopes.

Jeri Bennett announced that it is time to pay for the new year's membership. Pay Pal via www.flmf.org is one option for paying the \$40 annual dues. Members may also mail dues to Sandy Baker.

Barnes and Noble at Fair Oaks has offered to host a fundraiser for FLMF at a book fair celebrating the arts. The club would receive a percent of the money made during the day of the fair. Members discussed using the harpsichord. Sharon Reck asks for anyone interested in participating in or chairing such an event to contact her.

The RCC recitals are May 16. Shandra Love will not be able to be at the recitals due to a family emergency. If a participating teacher doesn't step up to chair, the recitals will be canceled, and no refunds will be given.

The next Ensemble Festival music selection meeting will be May 20 at the Pino home.

Lydia Kriso and Phyllis Vickers are stepping down as Vice Presidents. They asked for program suggestions from members to be given to incoming Vice Presidents Mark and Karen Pino.
